Interim Hearings Are Well Underway!

The month of June started interim hearings in both the House and Senate. Senate State Affairs, Business & Commerce, and Natural Resources & Economic Development Committees held hearings. The State Affairs Committee heard the charge on protecting Texas' lands. Of note, Vice-Chairman Angela Paxton commented that, while protecting Texas' lands are important, private property rights are also important and must be protected. The Business & Commerce hearing focused on the electric grid. The Natural Resources & Economic Development Committee hearing discussed the impact of the federal government's decisions regarding restricting liquified natural gas exports, supply chain limitations, a net-zero carbon agenda, and other air emission provisions on Texas. Part of this discussion included how many wells will become inactive if the EPA methane rule becomes effective.

In the House, the State Affairs Committee focused on the electric grid.

Since these are interim hearings, they are for information gathering. There are not any policy proposals before the committees.

This month, House State Affairs will hold a hearing to receive updates on rulemakings for several bills passed during the 88th legislative session. The Culture, Recreation, and Tourism Committee will meet to discuss the conservation of farm and ranch lands.

TLMA Files Amicus Briefs; Governor Makes Appointments to 15th Court of Appeals

TLMA recently filed two amicus briefs in the <u>Cactus Water</u> <u>Services v. COG Operating, LLC</u> and <u>Carl/White Trust v.</u> <u>Hilcorp</u> cases. You can read the briefs by clicking on each of the links above. Last session, Legislators passed bills that created the Texas Business Courts system. We have kept our members updated on this new judicial venue as it will impact many of our members. <u>Governor Abbott has</u> <u>appointed judges to the 15th Court of Appeals which is</u> <u>responsible for the appellate cases that come up through</u> the Business Court system.

Attorney General Opinion on Landmen and Wind Rights

Last fall, the Texas Real Estate Commission requested an opinion from the Attorney General on "whether a person who negotiates a lease of property for the development of a wind power project on behalf of another, for compensation, is required to hold a license issued by the Texas Real Estate Commission".

The Attorney General issued his <u>opinion</u> that a person is required to have a TREC license in the above mentioned situation. The opinion has the potential to have far-reaching implications including in the geothermal and solar industries.
